Report on Swachhata Hi Seva 2023 Campaign

Total Volunteers Engaged: 50 NSS Volunteers on average each day

The Swachhata Hi Seva 2023 campaign was celebrated with great enthusiasm by the NSS Unit of Netaji Subhash Mahavidyalaya, Udaipur, from 26th September to 1st October 2023. The campaign was part of the nationwide initiative aimed at promoting cleanliness, waste management, and creating a Garbage-Free India. The NSS volunteers, students, and faculty members participated actively in various Swachhata drives and Shramdaan activities during the week-long campaign.

The NSS Programme Officer and other faculty members welcomed the volunteers and set the tone for the week-long event. The primary goal was to instill the importance of cleanliness and environmental responsibility among students and the local community.
